Travel guidelines: Getting to Antwerp

By Plane

From Brussels Airport

If you're arriving by air via Brussels Airport, Antwerp is a 30' train ride away. Tickets can be bought via the "SNCB/NMBS" App, at the station or at www.belgianrail.be

From Antwerp Airport

By Train

Take a train to Antwerp Central station, regularly mentioned at the top of "world's most beautiful railway stations" lists.

Tickets can be bought via the "SNCB/NMBS" App, at the station or at www.belgianrail.be

By car

There are significant road works going on in the city centre of Antwerp, greatly impacting traffic. If you do need to arrive by car, make sure to use an up-to-date trip planner. The city of Antwerp offers a free journey planner at www.sna.be

Travel guidelines: Getting around in Antwerp

By bike

Probably the easiest and fastest way to getting around in Antwerp is by bike. The Velo bike-sharing system covers the whole city. A weekly pass of 10 euros comes with unlimited rides (30' maximum per ride). More info at www.velo-antwerpen.be/en

Walking

Antwerp is also surprisingly walkable. Even the AP Campus Kronenburgstraat (see below) is only a half an hour walk from the central station.

Public Transport

De Lijn covers Antwerp with bus and tram lines (both above- and underground). See www.delijn.be/en for network maps, route planner and ticketing info.

Taxi

Taxis can be found outside train stations. For most other places it's best to call a taxi

company, as hailing a cab on the street isn't customary. There are no car-sharing systems like Uber or Lyft active in Antwerp.
